In April, 2000, Bairnsdale's local theatre company was reformed and renamed 'Bairnsdale Production Line Theatre Company' following a hiatus of several years. The minutes from the AGM held in April showed a grand total of \$293.96 in the bank and that Trish Lewis offered her husband (and Mamma Mia's Director) to cut firewood for fundraising. (The minutes do not say whether or not John was aware of the offer)

The first show that the reformed company put on was Iolanthe, a classic Gilbert and Sullivan and very cheap to stage as there are no royalties to be paid on any G&S shows.



In 2001 BPLTC began

the tradition, which has been largely continued uninterrupted to today, of staging a musical and a play in the one year. But firstly, members participated in an Australia Day celebration in costume which was covered in the local paper. The musical chosen in 2001 was The Pirates of Penzance which was again chosen for it's audience popularity and relative cheapness. It is interesting to note that chorus members were not required to audition if they had performed in Iolanthe!





That year BPLTC also staged The Importance of Being Earnest in October of that year. The meeting notes for October show that there was discussion within the committee about the need to select a musical that was *not* a G&S for 2002. And yet, in 2002, the company staged...




The play selected for performance in 2002 was Arsenic and Old Lace. This was actually



staged in May and The Mikado was staged in October, it wasn't until several years later that this order was reversed. The minutes show that this play made a profit of \$2,651.62 for the company, which was quite significant when you consider how

low the budget most



The minutes from the meetings held through these years highlight many issues still faced by the committee today. Issues such casting ageappropriate performers, the male to female ratios required by the shows and getting people to sing and move at the same time. But thanks to the dedication of those early committee members and the production team members that they appointed, BPLTC was able to grow into the successful company that it is today. 
